

Refugee Sponsorship Update

It would be great to share some progress on our refugee sponsorship process, but we remain in a period of complete silence. In mid-February we became aware that the Mulamba family's rental home was sold, and they needed to find another place to live. Unlike Canada, in Uganda three months rent is required in advance. This was an impossibility for the family but through your generosity the money was made available. (Attached is a picture of them standing in front of their new home.)

We've also learnt more about some of the challenges they are facing daily. Work is extremely difficult to find and there is no guarantee that they will get paid for the work they do. Food prices continue to escalate, making it more difficult to purchase basic needs.

Because more money was collected than required to secure their new place, we will now be sending \$200.00 per month to help with basic living. That will cover about half of their required monthly needs. If the family hasn't arrived by Fall, another request for support will be sent to the Grace Church community.



In the meantime, prayer for their continued protection and health is appreciated. We are hopeful that one day soon we'll get an email telling us when they will be able to relocate to Winkler. We know this is in God's hands.


