

### From the Pastor

As a staff, and even as a Lead Team, we have been convicted lately at our retreats, that it is important that we demonstrate by example the spiritual growth and commitment that we are asking of you.

I have been working on my own Spiritual Growth Plan, as I hope you have, and my focus has been primarily on my witness and worship. As I do that, I see that those two things are closely related.

I often find that my own growth, especially my desire to grow in Christ, is stimulated by exploring the prophets of the Old Testament. As I work through this book of Joel to prepare messages for instance, the Lord is reminding me of many things and that the need to persevere, especially in bad times, is so important to growing in Christ.

One of the biggest things I have been reminded of is that I need to resist blaming when things are not going well, whether that be at home, at church, or anywhere. When I blame, I am turning responsibility for my well-being over to something or someone else. If I blame evil, or Satan, or some human institution like government or corporations, or Hollywood, or whatever, even church, I don't have to look at myself.

I don't have to acknowledge the possibility that maybe my "loving God" might be bringing difficulty to me to test the genuineness of my faith. "I'm a pastor after all, I am farther along in this journey of growth than most, so I don't have to work as hard at it". What a dangerous way of thinking. Maybe we even have these thoughts if

we've been "Christians" for our whole life. "I can go on cruise control now".

No, the more we grow, the more the Lord expects of us, the more Satan buffets us. And God is always asking for us to acknowledge Him in everything, to continually confess and repent, surrender to Him, so that He may be seen, His reputation glorified in the world through His church, you and I.

I don't always like it at first, but I do always appreciate the reminder from the Lord that I alone am responsible for my words and deeds no matter what the circumstances, and who or what is responsible for them. Thank You Jesus!

May God bless you in your new role as parents and as you continue to serve at YWAM in Texas.




### Coming Events
